ACCESS 2.0 for English Learners stands for Assessing Comprehension and Communication in English State-to-State for English Learners. ACCESS for English Learners (EL) is a standards-based English language proficiency test. It assesses social and instructional English as well as the language associated with language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies within the school context across the four language domains: Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing.

Why is an English Language Proficiency test required?

ACCESS for ELs 2.0 is a secure English language proficiency assessment administered to Kindergarten through 12th grade students who have been identified as English Learners (ELs). It is given annually in Illinois to monitor students' progress in acquiring academic English.

What are the components of the ACCESS?

Who will take this assessment in Medinah School District?

All K-8 English Learners must take the ACCESS Assessment. The Illinois Administrative Code indicates that we shall administer the ACCESS to each student identified through the home language survey and EL teacher. Every parent or guardian completes a home language survey when registering his/her child for school. If there is any indication that a student is exposed to another language on a daily basis, other than English, we may administer the language proficiency screener which determines whether or not your child qualifies for EL services.

PLEASE NOTE: Students do not need to be enrolled in the English Learners Program to participate in the ACCESS Assessment. Students who qualify for the program but choose to not receive services are still required to take ACCESS.

How many students within Medinah School District #11 will be taking the ACCESS?

It is projected that Medinah School District will have over 110 students across the K-8 school district participating in the assessment.

What are the EL Standards?

There are five content areas of the standards. The first is called social and instructional language (SI), which incorporates proficiencies needed to deal with the general language of the classroom and the school. The others are English language arts (LA), math (MA), science (SC), and social studies (SS).

For each grade level, the standards specify one or more performance indicators for each content area within each of the four language domains: Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing.



Purpose and Use of ACCESS for ELs 2.0

- Helps students and families understand students' current level of English language proficiency along the developmental continuum.
- Serves as one of multiple measures used to determine whether students are prepared to exit English language support programs.
- Generates information that assists in determining whether ELs have attained the language proficiency needed to participate meaningfully in content area classrooms without program support.
- Provides teachers with information they can subsequently use to enhance instruction and learning in programs for their English Learners.
- Provides the district with information that will help them evaluate the effectiveness of the EL Program.

When will my child exit from EL?

Students who receive an overall score of 4.8 on the ACCESS Test will no longer receive EL services and will no longer take the ACCESS Test.
