6. Superintendent's Report

- a) The enrollment is K-8 641, PK 60, Homeless 8, EL 187, and Medinah Park District 42 students.
- b) The district received 1 Freedom of Information. The request was from Ms. Janine Asmus requesting information of district employees who are certified librarians.
- c) The Illinois School Code required each school district to post the administrator and teacher salary benefits report on the school's website before October 1st.
- d) MAP Fall Math and Reading scores were reviewed.
- e) Review of NDSEC's Procedures for the Use Behavioral Interventions for Students with Active Individual Education Plans.
- f) Curriculum Nights were held in person. Primary School welcomed 93% of kindergarten families, 1st grade 53%, 2nd grade 66%; Intermediate School welcomed 40% 3nd grade, 58% 4th grade, 48% 5th grade; Middle School welcomed 35% 6th grade, 38% 7th grade, and 30% 8th grade.
- g) PTC is open for Fall conferences.
- h) Preschool screenings were held, and 12 students were eligible for the program. 57 students are currently enrolled in the program.
- i) PALS Night was held at Primary School on Wednesday, September 20, 2023. 90 people signed up to attend this community event. Preschoolers from Primary School, the Medinah Park District, and kindergarteners with their families were invited to attend the event.
- i) Cross Country is underway at Middle School with 68 students participating.
- k) Medinah's 5 Annual Color Run was held on Friday, September 8th. 100 people participated in the community event.
- 1) Medinah PTO held their annual Parent Volunteer Meeting.
- m) All district staff participated in a Zoom safety presentation with the Roselle Police Department. This was held on the 1st Early Dismissal.

- n) The district has applied to collaborate with the ROE and IDPH ACES grant to provide mental health services to students.
- o) The ROE and RFD inspected all Medinah buildings on Thursday, September 7th, and there were minor findings at all the buildings. The Key Performance Indicator in this area will remain green.
